


Place of "First Landing"


After arriving in Chetumal Bay, they settled along Hondo and New rivers on numerus Early Formative settlements that match the Tower of Babel time frame. These sites are the only settlements in Mesoamerica that meets the time frame of the Jaredite arrival.

Alma 22:30 And it bordered upon the land which they called Desolation, it being so far northward that it came into the land which had been peopled and been destroyed, of whose bones we have spoken, which was discovered by the people of Zarahemla, it being the place of their **first landing**.




The late Archaic timeframe is a perfect match for the new Jaredite settlers.

During the late Archaic, these lowland regions were inhabited by people who took full advantage of the rich natural biodiversity but also grew domesticates before becoming fully sedentary. Through time, they developed diverse management strategies to produce food, from the forest management system (which includes swidden agriculture), to larger scale land modifications such as terraces, and continued to rely on semidomesticated and wild plant resources. Although lowland populations came to eventually rely on maize as a staple, other resources such as root crops and fruit trees were also cultivated, encouraged, and consumed. Archaeological and genetic evidence indicates that domesticates including maize (Zea mays) and squash (Curcurbita sp.) were cultivated by Archaic hunter-gatherers as part of their mixed foraging/farming economies beginning around 3500 BC (Piperno and Smith 2012; Pohl et al. 1996).



The picture reflects the conditions that existed Archaically in the Pulislver Swamp, a few miles form where the "first landing" took place. A place just southwest of Chetumal Bay the proposed landing location of the Jaredites






Evidence that Olmecs Assimilated into the Maya Culture in a big way
