The La Union Barrow hill is a perfect match to the one describe in Alma 47

It is likely that the hill is a short distance from the land of Nephi, and it is probably hill that has significant military advantages. The only one that all four sides are steep and difficult to climb.

Evidence:

Hill Antipus is located near La Union Barrow which is about 20 miles from the Lamanite king or at Shemlon, in the land of Nephi. The hill is very tall and very unique, and all four sides are very steep. It is the only hill with these features for at least a fifty-mile radius Alma 47:2 . . .when the proclamation had gone forth among them, they were exceedingly afraid; yea, they feared to displease the king, and they also feared to go to battle against the Nephites lest they should lose their lives.

Alma 47:7 they had gathered themselves together upon the top of the mount, which was called Antipas, in preparation to battle.
